Last year, our tree planting crew was hard at work trying to reforest the banks of the Credit. They planted in excess of 25,000 trees ranging from the lower end of the river (Erindale Park) all the way up to The Grange Sideroad. Tree species this year included: Eastern Cottonwood, Silver Maple,


